Solving Problems of Anger and Mistreatment Biblical Guidelines

Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye. Colossians 3:13

- I. Chris tians must con trol an ger or they may be castaways from useful witness for Christ. I Corinthians 9:27 But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to oth ers, I myself should be a castaway.
 - A. Anger it self is not sin ful.
 - 1. God's righ teous an ger de fends good and attacks evil. Nehemiah 9:17 ...thou art a God ready to par don, gra cious and mer ci ful, slow to an ger, and of great kind ness... Psalm 7:11 God judgeth the righ teous, and God is an gry with the wicked every day.
 - 2. Man's righteous an geris a power fule motion de signed to mo bi lize us to de fend good and attack evil. Anger is righteous when under con trol and di rected at elim i nat ing the problem while help ing strengthen oth ers in righteousness. Nehemiah 5:6 And I was very an gry when I heard their cry... 9 Also I said, It is not good that ye do: ought ye not to walk in the fear of our God... 13 ... And all the congregation said, Amen, and praised the LORD.
 - 3. Je sus in di cates that there are causes for righteous anger. Anger without proper cause is condemned. Mark 3:2 And they [Pharisees] watched him [Je sus], whether he would heal him on the sabb ath day; that they might accuse him... 5 And when he had looked round about on them with an ger, be ing grieved for the hard ness of their hearts... Matt. 5:22 But I say unto you, That who so ever is an gry with h is brother with out a cause shall be in dan ger of the judg ment.
 - B. Sin ful an ger is ex pressed in two sin ful ways:
 - Clamming up—an ger is sin ful when turned inward into resentment and bitterness. Ecc.
 9 Be not hasty in thy spirit to be an gry: for an ger resteth in the bosom of fools. He brews 12:15 ...lest any root of bitterness springing up trou ble you, and thereby many be de filed.

- a. Seek to settle problems quickly, even before night fall. Ephe sians 4:26 Be ye an gry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath.
- b. Mat ters must be set tled with God first, then with others. Psalm 32:5...I will con fess my trans gressions unto the LORD; and thou forgavest the iniquity of my sin... James 5:16 Confess your faults one to an other, and pray one for an other...
- c. Unabated anger is condemned by God. Amos 1:11 Thus saith the LORD; For three trans gressions of Edom, and for four, I will not turn away the pun ish ment thereof; be cause... his an ger did tear per pet u ally, and he kept his wrath for ever.
- 2. Blowing up—anger is sinful when directed toward others in uncontrolled or harmful outbursts. Ephesians 4:29 Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may ministergrace unto the hearers. 30 And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption. 31 Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all mal ice: 32 And be ye kind one to an other, tenderhearted, for giving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath for givenyou.
- a. Anger is sinful when hastily ex pressed. James 1:19 Where fore, my be loved brethren, let ev ery man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath: 20 For the wrath of man worketh not the righteous ness of God.
- b. Hasty an ger causes strife. Prov. 15:18 A wrathful man stirreth up strife: but he that is slow to an ger appeaseth strife.
- c. The Bi ble di rects us to con trol and re strain anger. Counting to ten (or higher!) is in harmony with Biblical guidelines for controlling anger. Prov. 14:17 He that is soon an gry dealeth foolishly. 29 He that is slow to wrath is of great under stand ing: but he that is hasty of spirit exalteth folly.
- II. The Bible must guide Christian response when someone has been wronged. Psalm 73:24 Thou shalt guide me with thy counsel, and after ward receive me to glory.
- A. If you have wronged some one, you must go to the one you have wronged and be reconciled. Matt. 5:23 There fore if thou bring thy gift to the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath ought against thee; 24 Leave there thy gift be fore the altar, and go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and of fer thy gift.
- B. If someone has wronged you, you must go to

the of fender seek ing to re solve the problem and rebuild fellowship with him as described in Mat thew 18:15 More over if thy brother shall trespass against thee, go and tell him his fault between thee and him alone: if he shall hear thee, thou hast gained thy brother.

1. Christian witnesses will help you if necessary for resolution. Mat thew 18:16 But if he will not hear thee, then take with thee one or two more, that in the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established.

witnesses every word may be established.
2. Your church will help you if necessary for resolution. Matthew 18:17 And if he shall ne glect to hear them, tell it unto the church: but if he ne glect to hear the church, let him be unto thee as an hea then man and a publican.

- a. Of fenders who re fuse to sub mit to their church's decision must be considered as unsaved persons, and we should seek to win them to Christ. Gal. 1:16 ...that I might preach him [Christ] among the hea then. 2:9...we should go unto the heathen.
- b. Of fenders are never to be mis treated, for we are even to love our enemies. Luke 6:27 But I say unto you which hear, Love your enemies, do good to them which hate you.
- C. Three elements are involved in solving problems of mistreatment:
 - Repentance with confession of sin to God and to any others who have been offended. Acts 26:20 ...re pent and turn to God, and do works meet for repentance. Proverbs 28:13 He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy. James 5:16 Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another...
- 2. Forgiveness by God and by the one who has been of fended. I John 1:9 If we confess our sins, he [God] is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all un righteousness. Luke 17:3 ...If thy brother trespass against thee, rebuke him; and if he repent, for give him.
- 3. Reconciliation establishes new or renewed fellowship between the offender and God, and between the offender and offended party.II Cor. 5:18 And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us the min is try of reconciliation.
- III. Of fenders must repent to receive for give ness and reconciliation. Repentance is the changing of the mind concerning actions and ad mitting error. If the offender repents, he MUST

BE FORGIVEN. Luke 17:3 Take heed to yourselves: If thy brother trespass against thee, rebuke him; and if he repent, forgive him. 4 And if he trespass against thee seven times in a day, and seven times in a day turn again to thee, saying, I re pent; thou shalt forgive him.

- A. True repentance will bear fruit that shows change has taken place. Matthew 3:8 Bring forth there fore fruits meet for repentance.
- B. Works may show that an of fender has re pented, and specific words of repentance may not be necessary. Some have been openly sinful and many who have been offended may never be present to hear the offenders' words of repentance. Only God knows the heart of an offender. When of fend ers' works are seen which demonstrate repentance, of fenders must be for given, even though their repentant words have not been heard by those offended. Jonah 3:10 And God saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and God repented of the evil, that he had said that he would do unto them; and he did it not.
- IV. For give as Christ has for given you.

Ephesians 4:32 And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you. Colossians 3:13 ...if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye.

- A. Pray for those who of fend you. Pray that God will lead them to re pen tance, faith and for giveness. Luke 23:34 Then said Jesus, Father, for give them; for they know not what they do. And they parted his rai ment, and cast lots... 47 Now when the cen tu rion saw what was done, he glorified God, saying, Certainly this was a righteous man.
- B. Forgive offenders who repent. Repentance is changing the mind about actions thought to be right and ad mitting they are wrong. Repentance is necessary for for give ness of sins. To convert means to turn from wrong to right. Acts 3:19 Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blot ted out...
- C. To forgive without repentance falsely implies that Christ forgives without repentance. Luke 24:46 ... Thus it is writ ten, and thus it be hoved Christ to suf fer, and to rise from the dead the third day: 47 And that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name...
- D. Biblicalforgiveness requires work! Obey God

and you will never be a hyp o crite. It is not hypocritical to work at forgiveness because such work is obeying God! II Corin thi ans 10:5 Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bring ing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ.

- 1. You must do what is right no mat ter how you feel. If you do not feel like forgiving, then forgive anyway. Obey God and your feelings will improve. Galatians 5:19 Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these... 20 ...wrath, strife... 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, 23 Meekness, tem per ance: against such there is no law. 24 And they that are Christ's have cru ci fied the flesh with the af fec tions and lusts.
- 2. Avoid men tion ing the of fense. For give ness means no longer continuing to dwell on the sin that was for given. When you for give, each new of fense is not the sec ond, third, or seventh, etc. Each new of fense is al ways the FIRST! Psalm 103:12 As far as the east is from the west, so far hath he [the LORD] removed our transgressions from us. Psalm 32:1 Blessed is he whose transgression is for given, whose sin is covered.
- 3. Refuse to discuss the offense with others. Forgiveness means the problem will not be raised again to of fenders, to others, or to one-self Prov. 17:9 He that covereth a trans gression seeketh love; but he that repeateth a mat ter separateth very friends. I Pet. 4:8 And above all things have fer vent char ity among your selves: for char ity shall cover the mul titude of sins.
- 4. Put the offense out of mind by declining to think and dwell upon resentment or self-pity. He brews 10:17 And their sins and in iqui ties will I re member no more. 18 Now where re mis sion of these is, there is no more offering for sin.
- a. Holding grudges or brooding is a violation of the meaning of forgiveness. Leviticus 19:18
 Thou shalt not avenge, nor bear any grudge against the chil dren of thy peo ple, but thou shalt love thy neigh bour as thy self: I am the LORD.
 James 5:9 Grudge not one against another, breth ren, lest ye be con demned...
- b. Think on the right things and the peace of God will con trol the de sires of your heart (emo tions and feel ings) and the thoughts of your mind (intellect and memory). Philippians 4:7 And the peace of God, which passeth all un der standing,

- shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Je sus. 8 Finally, breth ren, what so ever things are true, what so ever things are hon est, what so ever things are just, what so ever things are pure, what so ever things are lovely, what so ever things are of good re port; if there be any vir tue, and if there be any praise, think on these things.
- V. Reconciliation must follow repentance and forgiveness. Acts 3:19 Repent ye therefore, and be con verted, that your sins may be blotted out... II Cor. 5:19 To wit, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation.
 - A. Every small an noy ance and of fense can not be subjected to the complete reconciliation process. We must learn to for give in love the many slight annoyances and offenses that are common to all sinners. Proverbs 10:12 Hatred stirreth up strifes: but love covereth all sins... 19:11 The discretion of a man deferreth his anger; and it is his glory to pass over a transgression.
 - B. Inreconciliation, peace and fellow shipre place enmity and alienation. Colossians 1:20 And, having made peace through the blood of his [Jesus'] cross, by him to reconcile all things unto himself... 21 And you, that were sometime a lien ated and ene mies in your mind by wicked works, yet now hath he reconciled.
 - 1. The of fended per son has no right to make the offender suffer more. Fre quently used methods for oppressing of fenders in volves the offended adopting a martyr stance of de pression, crying, self-pity, What did I do? attitude, etc. By such oppressive attitudes and statements one causes the supposedly forgiven of fender over a period of time to suffer for his/her sin. Psalm 119:121 I have done judgment and justice: leave me not to mine oppressors.
 - 2. Oppressive attitudes show that true for giveness has not been granted. God does not oppress of fenders when He grants for giveness in Je sus Christ. Matt. 18:21 Then came Pe ter to him, and said, Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I for give him? till seven times? 22 Je sus saith unto him, I say not unto thee, Until seven times: but, Until sev enty times seven.
 - 3. Both saved and un saved sin ners are capa ble of doing wrong, even when no one has prompted them. Romans 3:23 For all have

- sinned, and come short of the glory of God... 7:19 For the good that I would I do not: but the evil which I would not, that I do.
- VI. Turn over all unresolved problems to the LORD. Unresolved problems will finally be re solved by the LORD. Romans 12:19 Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord.
 - A. Turn over to the LORD all issues of unrepentant offenders. Proverbs 20:22 Say not thou, I will recompense evil; but wait on the LORD, and he shall save thee... 24:29 Say not, I will do so to him as he hath done to me: I will render to the man according to his work.
 - B. Neverbecome venge ful. Da vid turned over the prob lem to the LORD when he con tin ued to be mistreated by King Saul. I Samuel 24:12 The LORD judge between me [David] and thee [Saul], and the LORD avenge me of thee: but mine hand shall not be upon thee.
 - C. Do not mis treat peo plewho con tinue to mis be have or mis treat you. Romans 12:20 There fore if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink: for in so do ing thou shalt heap coals of fire on his head. 21 Be not over come of evil, but over come evil with good.
- VII. How to change. John 3:7 ... Ye must be born again. Gal. 3:26 For ye are all the chil dren of God by faith in Christ Jesus. II Cor. 5:17 There fore if any man be in Christ, he is a new crea ture: old things are passed away; be hold, all things are become new. Romans 13:14 But put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ...
 - A. Change re quires be lievers to put off bad hab its and to put ongood behavior as a new per son in Christ. Colossians 3:8 But now ye also put off all these; anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy com mu ni ca tion out of your mouth. 9 Lie not one to an other, see ing that ye have put off the old man with his deeds; 10 And have put on the new man, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him... 23 And what so ever ye do, do it heart ily, as to the Lord, and not unto men.
 - B. God de mands that be lievers changefrom being lust ful (feeling-motivated) to being sub missive (commandment-motivated) in all of our living. Romans 6:12 Let not sin there fore reign in your mortal body, that ye should obey it in the lusts thereof... 22 But now being made free from sin, and be come ser vants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life.

Ephesians 4:17 ...walk not as other Gentiles walk, in the van ity of their mind.

- 1. God changes us by renewing the image of God in man that was ruined by the sin and fall of Adam. Ephe sians 4:22 That ye put off concerning the for mer conversation the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceit ful lusts; 23 And be renewed in the spirit of your mind; 24 And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in right eousness and true holiness.
- 2. Biblical change breaks bad habits and replaces them with good habits. No change commanded by God is unrealistic for those who know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Philippians 4:13 I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me.

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
